A Few Notes from your District Councillor January 2022

PLANNING INSPECTOR BACKS SECTION TWO OF LOCAL PLAN FOR TENDRING

I am very pleased to report that Tendring District Council (TDC) has received a report from the independent Planning Inspectors. The Inspectors are backing Section Two of TDC's Local Plan, which means TDC can now move forward towards the final stages of adopting its new Local Plan.

Section Two was the subject of an online two-week public hearing earlier in the year, which then led to a series of main modifications to the report being sent to the Planning Inspectors, which then went out for a six-week public consultation over the summer.

This latest report from the Planning Inspectors follows the consideration of the comments that were made, and states that the document could now be found legally sound subject to the formal adoption of the main modifications with some minor amendments, which has now been completed.

A Local Plan is a strategic blueprint document setting out how development should take place across the district for the future, with the emerging Local Plan for Tendring covering the period until 2033.

Section One of the Local Plan, which was submitted jointly by Tendring District Council, with Colchester Borough Council and Braintree District Council, looking at strategic planning matters, has already been examined, approved, and adopted.

Section Two is unique to Tendring and provides more detail on where housing and other development will take place within the district.

The Planning Inspectors' letter will now be considered by TDC's Planning Policy and Local Plan Committee on 11 January 2022, it will then go onto the Cabinet before going to full council on 25 January 2022 for the vote on the adoption of the plan.

All these meetings will be held at Clacton Town Hall.

Cllr. Nick Turner, Chairman of the Planning Policy and Local Plan Committee, welcomed the Inspectors' letter. He said, "This is resounding good news for Tendring, meaning that subject to the final few steps required to formally adopt our Local Plan we now have a definitive shape to the growth of our district for the coming decade.

NEW INITIATIVE LAUNCHED TO HELP HOMES IN TENDRING TO BE WARMER, GREENER AND SAVE ON FUEL BILLS THIS WINTER

People across Tendring are being encouraged to check if they are eligible to receive help under a new scheme being launched to help local householders be warmer in their homes, lower their carbon emissions, and save money on their fuel bills this winter.

Under the Green Homes Grant Local Authority Delivery scheme, delivered by Warmworks on behalf of Tendring District Council and through funding from the UK Government, householders can apply to receive improvements to increase the comfort and warmth in their home. The scheme offers a wide range of insulation measures and renewable heating technologies.

The scheme is open to homeowners, private tenants, and people in social rented accommodation, where the home has a low energy rating and a low annual income.

Warmworks will arrange a survey in the homes of eligible householders to agree the work that will be carried out. An accredited and registered sub-contractor team then completes the installation of the agreed heating and energy-efficiency measures before an independent

inspection assesses the completed work against rigorous quality standards. Where required, Warmworks will also then arrange for a full annual service to be completed 12 months later.
